BOCCI 14 SERIES

Bocci, a young contemporary design and manufacturing house based in Vancouver, Canada is well known for large chandelier installations and custom fabrications of extremely large proportions. Bocci's 14 series—a family of low-voltage pendant lighting products designed to be clustered in groups—is featured in hotels, restaurants, retail establishments and high-profile homes worldwide.

“Bocci has been extremely successful with its first piece, the 14, especially with large custom chandelier fabrications,” says creative director Omer Arbel. In 2007, the 14 won the prestigious Red Dot Design Award as well as a Good Design Award from the Chicago Athenaeum Museum of Architecture and Design. The 14 was also a finalist for the 2007 iF product design award and for the 2006 “Best Newcomer” Blueprint award.

Visually quite subtle, each individual pendant is an articulated, seamed cast glass sphere with a frosted cylindrical void that houses a 10 Watt halogen bulb or .4 Watt LED. When lit, the glow of the lights gives the effect of tiny candles floating in a sphere of water. The light interacts with the imperfections and bubbles of the cast glass to make a visually rich halo of light. Because cast glass is an organic process, imperfect by nature, each piece produced is distinctive. Bocci's versatile lighting enhances any environment from public spaces to residential settings.

Custom fabrications of extremely large proportions are featured in high profile locations including the Phillip Lim boutique in Soho and Karl Lagerfeld boutique in Paris; W Hotels in Montreal and Atlanta; Neda in San Francisco and Dubai; Club Monaco in Hong Kong; Axis Casino in Nottingham UK, Ilori stores throughout North America; STK restaurants in New York and Los Angeles and many others.
